Medium Strength Blue Threadlocker and High Strength Red Threadlocker Stick

When Loctite 248 Medium Strength Blue Threadlocker Stick is applied to a threaded fastener, it can be disassembled using hand tools. This anaerobic adhesive is typically used for machine tools, presses, pumps, compressors, mounting bolts and gear boxes that require maintenance or servicing.





Loctite 268 High Strength Red Threadlocker Stick can be removed with localized heat and hand tools. Intended for more permanent, heavy duty applications, this adhesive is typically used on heavy equipment, suspension bolts, bearing cap bolts and studs, and motor, transmission or pump mounts.
